

COLORS OF THE WORLD PLANTERS

We live in a beautiful world of diversity. This simple craft project is a great way to encourage kids to think about the diverse family and community in which they live.

By using craft paints in "people colors," children can be reminded about the importance of representation and the diversity of the world around them.

SUPPLIES

- terracotta vase (or paper cup)
- craft paints in "people colors"
- permanent marker
- paint brushes
- vinyl (or craft paint)
- scissors
- wooden Popsicle stick

NOTES:

If you don't have a terracotta planter, you can use a paper cup, an old planter or even an upcycled pint of ice cream.



DIRECTIONS

Paint the terracotta planter in your choice of "people colors." This is a great time to talk to kids about the diversity of their family and community!

Once dry, use a permanent marker to draw eyes onto the planter

Cut vinyl into the shape of lips then stick on to the planter. If you don't have vinyl you can draw the lips on with paint or another permanent marker. Get creative!

Use your planter to create an herb garden and you can even use an upcycled Popsicle stick as a plant marker! Simple cut the end of the stick into a point, then write the name of the plant onto the stick. Place it in the pot and you're ready to display!
